1. A Defeatist Plausibility
Structure: Dead People Do Not
Rise.

"The world and its way of thinking says: 'What is dead stays dead!' The church and its way of thinking says: "He is not here, he is risen, just like he said; the sting of death is gone! I see all things through the empty tomb."

The Scriptures teach that the resurrection of Jesus promises not only physical resurrection but spiritual resurrection. Christ raises physically and spiritually dead people to life.

Ephesians 2:1-7

"And you were dead in the trespasses and sins in which you once walked, following the course of this world, following the spirit that is at work in the sons of disobedience—among whom we all once lived in the passions of our flesh, carrying out the desires of the body and the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, like the rest of mankind."

A Plausibility structure of hopelessness.
