Learning to Sing a New Song Psalm 96

"Oh sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth!" Psalm 96:1

"The idea is of a 'fresh song', responding to truth, freshly received, fresh experience. Just as 'compassion is 'new every morning' (Lamentations 3:22-23) so is the responsive song." Alec Motyer

Singing a new song ought to be a cultivated spiritual discipline of the community of God's people.

We ought to continually foster fresh appreciations of the gospel and fresh expressions of joy and praise unto the Lord.

I. Sing, Sing, Sing: Continually See, Savor, and Celebrate Yahweh's Mighty Acts and Majestic Character. Psalm 96:1-6

"O sing to the LORD a new song; sing to the LORD, all the earth. Sing to the Lord, bless his name; tell of his salvation from day to day." Psalm 96:1-2

• Replay an Old Song: The Gospel - "Tell of his salvation from day to day."

• Retell it to new people/peoples. "Declare his glory among the nations, his marvelous works among all the peoples! For great is the Lord, and greatly to be praised; he is to be feared above all gods."

II. Ascribe, Ascribe: Make It Your Ambition to Prioritize His Praise In Your Life Even When You Are Spiritually Dry. Psalm 96:7-10

"Ascribe to the LORD, O families of the peoples, ascribe to the LORD glory and strength! Ascribe to the Lord the glory due His name..."
Psalm 96:7-8

• Show Up And Serve Sacrificially: Bring to God what you have and let Him give you what you need. "bring an offering, and come into his courts!"

"I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship." Romans 12:1

Holiness: Pursue the Holiness that You Possess In Christ.
 "Worship the Lord in the splendor of holiness; tremble before him, all the earth!" Psalm 96:9

 Confidence: Affirm what is true over all in the face of everything that is broken and contradictory – "Our God Reigns!"

III. Rejoice, Rejoice: Anticipate and Celebrate the LORD'S Coming to Reign. Psalm 96:11-13
